What is Kinship Care?

Kinship care can be defined as the full-time nurturing and protection of children by relatives who have a kinship bond with children when those children have been separated from their biological parents.

- Are you concerned about how to communicate with the child's parent?
- Are you adjusting to your new role with the child?
- Is the child adjusting to your new role in their life?
- Are the needs of the child more than you can bear at times?

To meet these needs, the Kinship Caregiver Program of Catholic Charities provides support to relative caregivers using a family systems approach.

The program encourages families to access existing community resources, as well as form new relationships with other community organizations and services.

Services Provided

CATTARAUGUS COUNTY

Advocacy: Active support and promote rights of the family, that is, the caregiver(s) and the children

Assessment and Referral to Family Counseling: Help and support for the family, as a whole and each member

Case Management: Organize services for the family

Kinship Youth Group: Connects children who are no longer living with their biological parents and provides support with others who, like them, are in a kinship family. Groups look for opportunities to volunteer in the community; currently held at an Olean school.

Outreach: Outreach to families in need, including home visits

Parenting Education: A refresher on parenting in today's world

Referral and Linkage: Assists with connecting to other resources in the family's community; including legal, financial and human services

Support & Activity Group Meetings:

Combines the support group and care coordination with YMCA family membership, family events, programs and youth activities. Held bi-monthly at YMCA of the Twin Tiers facility in Olean.

ALLEGANY COUNTY

Support & Activity Group Meetings:

Combines the support group and care coordination with YMCA family membership, family events, programs and youth activities. Held bi-monthly at YMCA of the Twin Tiers facility in Wellsville.



Eligibility

Children must be TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) eligible or eligible for public cash assistance. Children living with a non-parent caregiver who are eligible to receive a 'child-only' TANF grant, regardless of the caregivers income.

The children don't have to be in court ordered legal arrangements such as guardianship or kinship foster care. Arrangements made with the child's parents are acceptable for this program.

There is no cost for the program services. Long-term counseling services may be paid through insurance or based on sliding fee, if referred to another Catholic Charities program.

Support for the Kinship Caregiver Programs are provided by the Cattaraugus County Department of Social Services, YMCA of the Twin Tiers, and the Health Foundation for Western and Central New York
