Our Counselors work with clients on reaching their goals, utilizing a person-centered approach throughout the treatment process. Medication Assisted Therapy options are also available, such as Buprenorphine/Suboxone, Vivitrol, Campral, nicotine replacement therapy, etc.

### *What is Medication Assisted Therapy?*

Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT), in combination with counseling and behavioral therapies, provides a client-centered approach to the treatment of substance use disorders. CASA-Trinity offers a comprehensive list of medications that can be used for Medication-Assisted Treatment.

Suboxone, Subutex, Sublocade and Vivitrol are used for opiate use disorder. Vivitrol, acamprosate and Antabuse are prescribed for alcohol use disorder as needed. We also offer nicotine replacement therapy to aid in smoking cessation.

CASA-Trinity employs physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants as well as registered nurses. Registered nurses perform a medical assessment to help refer clients to primary care physicians and dentists in the area if needed and offer testing for Hepatitis, HIV and TB. Physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants can prescribe medications for the treatment of substance use disorders.

### *Types of medication offered:*

**Buprenorphine/Suboxone:** The process of prescribing this medication includes assessing the needs of the patient, a physical examination, and lab work to ensure that the client is healthy. This is a medication indicated for maintenance treatment of opioid dependence. This oral medication is a combination of Buprenorphine and Naltrexone. Buprenorphine helps block other opioids from attaching to the opioid receptors in the brain. Naloxone is a medication used to reverse an overdose from opioids.

**Campral:** Can reduce the desire to drink, and Antabuse (disulfiram), which treats problem drinking by creating an unpleasant reaction to alcohol, are also available.

**Naltrexone (a.k.a. Vivitrol):** This medication is a once-a-month injection that aids in the reduction of cravings from alcohol and opiates. The process of prescribing this medication includes assessing the needs of the patient, a physical examination, and lab work to ensure that the client is healthy.

The patient will continue to receive counseling services and will receive education on the reactions, effects and the process of the way this medication works to aid in the reduction of cravings.

Sublocade: A monthly injectable form of buprenorphine used to treat moderate to severe opioid use disorders in people who have been stabilized on the Suboxone film.

Nicotine Replacement Therapy: NRT includes assessing the needs of the patient and if necessary, prescribing certain medications that may aid in abstinence from nicotine such as: nicotine patches, lozenges, gum, and or other forms of medication that may reduce the desire for nicotine.
